Ricky Shelton is a Cookeville, TN native and lifelong resident who was elected mayor in 2014. Shelton serves on numerous boards and commissions in his capacity as mayor, including Cookeville Regional Medical Center Board of Trustees, the Upper Cumberland Development District, the Upper Cumberland Regional Airport Authority, the Upper Cumberland Human Resource Agency, Putnam County 911 Board, the Upper Cumberland Family Justice Center Board, as well as Vice Chairman of the Joint Economic and Community Development Board Executive Committee. Mayor Shelton and his wife Shannon are parents to six children.
